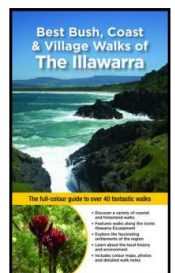
Native Trees of the NSW South Coast By Kevin Mills and Jacqueline Jakeman

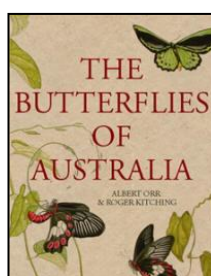

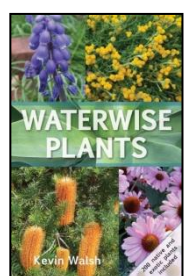
The Butterflies of Australia by Albert Orr & Roger Kitching
